INTRODUCTION TO THE 2019-20 PUBLIC ART PROGRAM

In 2019, the Cultural Council acknowledged multiple paths for enhancing the City through the work of artists and designers. It established the Public Art Program. The Public Art Program manages the Art in Public Places program for the City, serves as a creative advisor to City agencies, and develops its own public art projects through collaboration with non-profits, foundations and the private sector.

History of the Cultural Council and Public Art

The City of Jacksonville awarded its management of the Art in Public Places program to the Cultural Council of Greater Jacksonville in 2006 via amendment to ordinance code Chapter 126, Part 9. In 2011, the City created the SPARK District that resulted in many temporary artworks in the downtown in 2013-14 sponsored by the Cultural Council. In 2016, Art Republic began the giant murals and Haskell Sculpture Initiative starts. With the increased art impact, the Downtown Investment Authority contracted with the Public Art Program of the Cultural Council to produce multiple murals, wraps, bike racks and sculptures downtown. In 2018, JEA supported lighting the DIA public art projects via contribution to the Cultural Council.

By municipal code Section 126, Part 9, the Cultural Council of Greater Jacksonville is required to create an annual plan for the Art in Public Places program for each fiscal year. In August 2019, the Cultural Council assigned the Art in Public Places Committee the task of drafting the City's required plan. The APP Committee developed the plan in August and September, 2019. The FY 2019-20 plan was adopted by the Cultural Council in October 2019.

Collaborative Projects

The annual plans reserves \$70,088 in APP Trust dollars for opportunities to collaborate with City Council Members and City departments and agencies. The projects will prioritize commissioning Jacksonville and NE Florida artists.

District City Council Members will be asked to recommend specific facilities, especially parks, for new artworks in their districts. To provide sufficient funding, Council Members may provide additional support and recommend community organizations that might support public art and the enhancement it brings to a local park or facility.

City departments will be asked if the skills of artists might enhance their planned CIP project. As an example, in the summer of 2019, Public Work and Cultural Council formed a partnership to repair the fountain and the Yates Building. By adding a small amount of APP funds to the existing Public Works budget, an artist has been hired to re-tile the fountain as public artwork.

As part of this Collaborative project and the 5 Year APP Plan, the Cultural Council will establish an internal City community of various departments to recommend locations and projects for City facilities.

Empower Jacksonville Artists

Jacksonville has a vibrant and talented community of visual artists, but public art is only recently emerging as a part of the art economy. In the last five years, Jacksonville has seen the rapid growth of outdoor murals by Jacksonville artists and training in public sculpture at the University of North Florida. But the real potential to expand artist opportunities in public art lies in the ability to hire or collaborate with fabricators, manufacturers, contractors and designers.

A significant percentage of successful public artists do not fabricate their public art projects. Digital design and computer driven tools make the physical objects. For example, traffic cabinet wraps are designed by artists, but produced by sign printers/installers. The 2019 DUUUVAL bike rack was shaped by a computer driven cutter and a Jacksonville fabricator coordinated the painting and installation.

The Empower Jacksonville Artist project will research the fabricators, manufacturers, contractors and designers in NE Florida that are available to work with artists. A database will be made for use by artists. Workshops in the database and video examples of working with fabricators will be made available in-person and online. In the next few years, the APP program will commission NE Florida artists to use these tools and expand their capabilities.

DIA Phase III Urban Art Facade and Streetscape Program

In 2016, the Downtown Development Authority contracted with the Cultural Council to manage the Urban Art Face and Streetscape program for the Northbank Downtown Community Redevelopment Area. According to the agreement.

The project is an arts-based civic engagement initiative to promote community development through urban design and attractive streetscape elements with the semipermanent and permanent public art installations on public property with the Northbank Downtown CRA.

Phase III follows the projects of the first two phases with sculptures, murals, bike racks, street furnishings and traffic cabinet wraps. The total contract value is \$85,625 with \$64,219 for art, \$12,844 CCGJ staff management, \$4,281 for administrative cost and \$4,281 for the APP Trust maintenance fund.

Given the age of the agreement, the first step will be to re-confirm the specific projects and expenditures on each.

Contribution to the City Council's 2019-20 Budget Priorities

Each year, the City Council adopts budget priorities for the coming fiscal year. In the 2019-20, the City Council sought significant improvements to the fiscal quality and maintenance of City Parks and hoped to coordinate with FDOT on the appearance of high visibility corridors.

Quality of Life

- 1. The Mayor will increase funding to the Parks, Recreation and Community Services Department for the purpose of improving the maintenance of city parks, athletic fields and playgrounds, boat ramps and riverfront walkways.
- 2. Increase Countywide Parks and Recreation Projects budget by \$1 million (from \$2 million to \$3 million) for FY19-20 to be used for maintenance, upgrades and repairs of existing park facilities.
- 7. Coordinate with FDOT to explore opportunities to improve the appearance of high visibility corridors.

Satisfying Art in Public Places Code Public Art Standards and Jacksonville Artists

By Municipal Code Sec. 126.902, the City Council established the public art standards for artwork in the City of Jacksonville.

Public art standards.

- (a) Public art is a work of art to which the general public has open and easy access and which will enrich and give dimension to the public environment, and which reflects generally accepted community standards of aesthetic appeal and artistic expression in the decorative arts.
- (b) The goal of the Art in Public Places Committee of the Cultural Council of Greater Jacksonville will be to choose art which is compatible with and which will enhance the architecture and general environment of the City. In some cases, the work will be site specific (i.e. art which is commissioned especially for the specific space and becomes integral to the site). Such art may relate to the function and the users of the facility, to the history or population of its neighborhood and/or may become a part of its architecture. ...

By Municipal Code Sec. Sec. 126.907, the City Council established goals for the purchase of artwork from Greater Jacksonville.

(b.) The Cultural Council and the Art in Public Places Committee shall seek to ensure that at least 15 percent of the artists selected for purchase or commission will be resident(s) in the Greater Jacksonville area, (the counties of Duval, St Johns, Nassau, Clay and Baker).
