

Art in Public Places Cultural Council Board Meeting February 21, 2019

- The two Calls to Artists for Neighborhoods Public Art projects closed for submissions on February 9, 2019. Cuba Hunter Park received 51 submissions, and the Winton Drive/Legends Community Center received 64 submissions. Art Selection Panelists are scoring submissions in preparation for panel meetings on February 20, 21, & 22. <u>https://vimeo.com/314154112</u>
- The Downtown Investment Authority (DIA) Art Selection Panel (ASP) voted on February 7 to recommend three of four design artist proposals to the APPC on February 13. The fourth design proposal was not approved, revisions are in progress. The APPC will vote to approve, and APP will present the final design to the Downtown Development Review Board (DDRB). On February 15, APP received unanimous approval from the DDRB for the three designs. Each member praised the efforts and outcome of the projects downtown. APP will present to the 4th Proposal to the DDRB.
- Three Water Street Parking Garage semi-finalists have submitted initial concept designs. Art Selection Panelists are reviewing their submissions in preparation for the ASP panel meeting on February 21, 2019 at which the ASP will award the winning finalist.
- Evergreene Architectural Arts has been selected to provide conservation services for 24 priority 1 and 2 public artworks and memorials. Contract negotiations are in progress. On-site assessments begin early March.
- Two UNF students and one UNF graduate are participating in the APP Internship Program for this spring semester.
