# Winton Drive and Legends Community Center Neighborhoods Projects

# **New Duval County Courthouse Project**

After a discussion at the May 2019 APP Committee, the planning phase will begin late summer, early fall 2019. This includes research and discovery including the identification of potential funding sources and partnerships. The budget is approximately \$619,000.

**Law and Liberty:** The City and the judiciary have approved the interior site for reinstalling two city-owned bronze figures from the old courthouse into the new. The project will be complementary to the New Duval County Courthouse project. The artwork is part of the City art collection and the re-installation with be privately funded through donations to Cultural Council.

### **Appraisal and Deaccession:**

The City has signed a contract to appraise the value of 92 artworks that are not part of the conservation project. The Public Art Program needs to develop a draft deaccession policy for the City and Cultural Council adoption.

#### **Downtown Sculpture Initiative**

Developing new agreement with Dave Engahl representing Preston Haskell. The Cultural Council will help facilitate the proposed sculptures in downtown.

# FDOT/Jacksonville University Roundabout Sculpture Project

Submissions have been received by JU for the \$220,000 outdoor sculpture commissioned for the roundabout at the intersection of University Boulevard and Merrill Road. Three artists made presentations in May. Final selection before June.

#### Main Street Park

The Mayor's Office made a request to the Cultural Council's Public Art Program to utilize Main Street Park this summer with the Mayor's Youth Work Program. Proposals were made and we are working with Downtown Vision on the schedule and funding.
